Dear Parent/Guardians

I am writing to inform you that following the cancelation of our under 11s game on Sunday 23rd January against Langley Hawks, any player who fails to inform us that they are not available to attend matches or training without contacting us will have their registration cancelled with immediate effect at Junior Elite Football Club.

Any player who is late for games will not be considered to play in that game. There is no question that we have an attendance and punctuality issue with some of our players and parents and this type of poor attitude is having a knock on effect on the rest of our players and parents who are always prepared and ready for matches and well also effect and damage our chances of winning the League Title that we have been working extremely hard to win.

A lot of time and effort is put into preparing for matches by both the players and the coaching staff and for us to have to cancel a game for these reasons were both embarrassing and frustrating.

To play or be associated to Junior Elite you have to be one hundred percent committed to both training and games, if any player or parent feels that they cannot do this then we are not the club for you to be at. Below is a structure of how we prepare for match day, this will identify why players need to be on time all the time.

- Meeting time one hour before kick off time
- Player's changing time: 15mins
- Team Talk/Attacking/Defending tactics: 15mins
- Warm up Jog/stretches/sprints: 10mins
- Ball warm up Quick passing drills/Team shape work: 15min
- Last team talk/reminders of roles responsibilities: 5mins

Between now and the end of the season we will be monitoring closely the attendance and punctuality of all the players at our club.
